October 20 1957

Mr. Hammer also informed us that 3,000 walleye fingerlings from the Johnson pond had been planted in Long Lake, September 1957.

Ralph Mabee reported that he talked to Bert Dumbauld regarding the extension of Chippewa Drive Rd. west from the lake, cross highway No. 35 to highway No. 87 and Mr. Dumbauld told him the timber land the road would have to cross to No. 87 was owned by a corporation and that it was very doubtful if they would give permission to put a road thru there.

Ralph Mabee spoke briefly in regard to road signs on our several hills and dangerous curves along our lake side roads. Several of the members expressed their views on this project.

Durward Hester made a few remarks regarding the electric light and power situation also Mr. Kline spoke briefly. President Tam appointed Mr. Kline and Mr. Winegardner on the committee with Mr. Hester to investigate further on the
